

Summary of Changes: Environmental Justice Self-Designation Process Document

- 1. An explanation of the purpose of environmental justice (EJ) self-designation has been added.
- 2. A definition of environmental justice has been added.
- 3. An explanation of "environmental justice expert" has been added.
- 4. Staggering committee member terms (2-years) has been added.
- 5. Committee member term limit (6-years) has been added.
- **6.** Committee member selection and renewal determination by sitting members, Program Administrator and the IPA has been added.
- **7.** A clarification of who can submit an EJ-SD application (CBOs, govt, community residents) has been added.
- 8. A more detailed scoring rubric has been added.
- **9.** A sample scoring rubric showing examples of indicators (radon, birth characteristics) was added to give the reader more insight into how applications can be scored.
- **10.** Information about the frequency of meetings and turnaround time for committee questions was added.
- 11. Information was added about the option to have a feedback session after the determination.
- 12. The timing of mapping updates (2 weeks after determination) was added.
- 13. The list of environmental indicators used for calculating EJ communities was added.
- 14. Explanations were added to the list of resources.
- **15.** The list of resources was categorized by indicator category (exposure, environmental effects, sensitive population, and socioeconomic factor)
- 16. Links to additional mapping tools (CDC and US Council on Environmental Quality) were added.
